A desire to immerse himself in a learning community in preparation for pastoral ministry — and to build on the theological and practical training he received at Canadian Mennonite University — was part of what drew **Lee Hiebert** (MDiv 2017), now Lead Pastor at Steinbach (Manitoba) Mennonite Church, to relocate to AMBS. He's expressed gratitude for the scholarships he received and for being able to pay most of his costs at par — benefits he said made AMBS financially comparable to any Canadian school for him: "If it was not for the generosity of donors and the foresight of many folks who have gone before, this experience wouldn't have been possible for me."

Benefits for Canadians

Academics and community life (continued)

- AMBS is accredited by the **Association of Theological Schools** in both Canada and the U.S.
- The U.S. government has approved the MDiv Connect program, so Canadian students can participate in on-campus sessions. Crossing the border is made as easy as possible (in nonpandemic times), and we'll help you at every step.
- Canadian students are able to transfer approved graduate-level courses to AMBS from accredited schools, so they can begin a graduate program in Canada and transfer those credits to complete their degree at AMBS.
- A collaborative arrangement between AMBS and **Conrad Grebel University College** in Waterloo, Ontario, allows Canadian students to complete a Master of Theological Studies at Grebel/University of Waterloo and then apply eligible course credits toward a Master of Divinity at AMBS.
- AMBS's student body includes students from around the world and from various Christian traditions. Learning opportunities reflect the worldwide Christian church.
- On-campus housing is available for lower-than-market prices for individuals and families.

Is AMBS affordable for Canadians?

- AMBS offers generous **need-based financial aid, scholarships** for full- and part-time students, and **grants of up to \$2,000 per year** that match contributions toward a student's tuition from churches or regional churches. Student loans administered by provincial governments are also available.
- The **Mennonite Church Eastern Canada (MCEC) scholarship** is available for Canadians who currently serve, or have a desire to serve, Mennonite Church Canada. Students from MCEC congregations are given preference.
- Canadian students **pay tuition at par** and can exchange up to \$1,500 CAD at par with U.S. dollars each semester to use for living expenses.
- Current students in a graduate program at Canadian Mennonite University or Conrad Grebel University College receive a **50% tuition discount** for all online classes. Students not enrolled in a graduate program receive a 50% tuition discount for their first online course.
- On-campus student employment opportunities are available.
