Study on campus

- Master of Divinity Campus (80 credit hours)
- Master of Arts in Christian Formation (60 credit hours)
- Master of Arts: Theology and Peace Studies (60 credit hours)
- Graduate Certificate in Theological Studies (21 credit hours; customizable)

Take a seminary course this spring! (Jan. 11 – April 29, 2022, unless noted)

- Online courses: Anabaptist History and Theology; Islam and Christian-Muslim Relations;
 Spiritual Practices: Play and Rest; Strange New World of the Bible 2. (The weekly online coursework for these courses can be done on your own schedule.)
- Campus/blended courses: Biblical Foundations for Peace and Justice; Church and Race;
 Job and Wisdom; Power and Process: Mennonite Polity Colloquium (six sessions only);
 Sexuality and Colonialism; Understanding the Church's Contexts; Witness Colloquium.
 (You can join these campus courses via live videoconference during posted class times.)
- Campus only courses: Anabaptist History and Theology; Biblical Hermeneutics and History of Interpretation; Christian Worship: Theory and Practice; Strange New World of the Bible 2; Spiritual Practices: Intentional Living in an Age of Diversions.

AMBS-Grebel sequential degrees

A collaborative arrangement between AMBS and **Conrad Grebel University College** allows Canadian students to complete a Master of Theological Studies at Grebel/Univ. of Waterloo and apply eligible credits toward a Master of Divinity at AMBS. **ambs.ca/grebel**

Yes, you can afford seminary!

AMBS offers generous need-based financial aid, scholarships and matching grants to make your education affordable. Canadian students pay tuition at par and can exchange up to \$1,200 CAD at par with U.S. dollars each semester to use for living expenses.
